# Approval of the July 2017 Treasurer's Reports:

Brian Oliver moved for approval of the July 2017 Treasurers Report showing Farmington with a cash balance of \$237,946.51. \$148,211.06 in checking and \$89,735.45 in the MMDA account. Jamie Lopez seconded the motion, the motion passed.

Ordinance 236-17: Brian Oliver moved to adopt Ordinance 236-17 the vacation & sale of the alley lying between lots 1-8, Block 10 Truax Addition, Town of Farmington to Walter Mark Hellinger. Jamie Lopez seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Ordinance 237-17: Brian Oliver moved to adopt Ordinance 237-17 the vacation & sale of the unopened alley lying between lots 1-8, Block 26 Sheehan's 1st Addition, Town of Farmington to Walter Mark Hellinger. Jamie Lopez seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Ordinance 238-17: Brian Oliver moved to adopt Ordinance 238-17 the vacation & sale of the alley lying between lots 1-8, Block 41 Truax Addition, Town of Farmington to Walter Mark Hellinger. Jamie Lopez seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Ordinance 239-17: Brian Oliver moved to adopt Ordinance 239-17 the vacation & sale of the portion of Alder Street between Church & Pine lying between Lots 1-4 Block 10, & Lots 1-4 Block 48 of Truax Addition, Town of Farmington to Walter Mark Hellinger. Jamie Lopez seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Ordinance 240-17: Brian Oliver moved to adopt Ordinance 240-17 the vacation & sale of the portion of Church Street between Bridge & Alder lying between Lots 5-8 Block 41 of Truax Addition & Lots 1-4 Block 48 of Truax Addition, Town of Farmington to Walter Mark Hellinger. Jamie Lopez seconded the motion. The motion passed.

# **Water Quality Testing Concerns:**

The Mayor and Councilmembers formally considered recommendations for additional and more frequent water testing from Farmington resident Julie Bussing. Council decided to continue as is, with the mandated testing schedule of Farmington's town water supply, which is overseen by the Department of Health and the Federal Government. Council agreed that because Farmington is in compliance with all water testing (and is without findings), that adding to Farmington testing expense at the request of one resident would not show good fiscal responsibility on their part. They offered that if a concerned taxpayer would like to have additional tests conducted on the water, they could do so by taking samples to a certified lab and having the testing done their personal expense. The names of the 2 available laboratories in our area (which are certified testing sites approved for the State of Washington) can be made available by Farmington's Water Operator.

# Farmington Volunteer Fire Department Update -Brian Oliver:

Brian Oliver reported that he has been in contact with Chief Mike Baggott and Marv Pillers of the Palouse Volunteer Fire Department and has learned that Palouse's pumper truck (which Farmington has first option to buy), will be pump tested on September 9<sup>th</sup>. Brian will advise the council at their September 18<sup>th</sup> meeting as to the outcome of the truck's testing. If the truck tests out as planned arrangements for the purchase of the truck should be finalized. Council asked Brian to send the clerk a description of Farmington's current pumper truck so that a sealed bid advertisement for sale can be placed in the Whitman County Gazette. Council agreed on a minimum starting bid price of \$3,000.00.

#### Council's Comments:

 Brian Oliver reported that the FVFD Building has been rented out as a wedding reception venue for the Erickson Wedding on October 28<sup>th</sup>, 2017. District 10 – who owns the majority share of the building with handle the rental details.

#### Clerk-Treasurer Comments:

 The clerk reported that numerous citizens have raised concerns over the lack of care being given to the two Memorial Rose Gardens at the park. Mayor Baker stated that he will direct Farmington's grounds maintenance employee to take an active role in the care of this area.

#### Mayor's Comments:

- Mayor Baker reported that Todd Gabbard from Gabbard Electric has finished making repairs at the Sewer Lift Station.
   The Mayor advised the council that he has purchased a radio communicator alert system for the lift station at a cost of less than \$500.00.
   However future installation of the system could run as much as \$500.00.
- The Mayor advised the Council that Councilmember Jason Brausen may be giving up his position on the Council due to work obligations. The Mayor asked the Council to consider who they would like to appoint to the Jason's position in the even Jason were to resign.

Mayor Baker stated that he will be contacting Bill Foreyt a licensed problem animal trapper from Colfax, to enlist Bill's services in getting rid of the recent skunk infestation here in Farmington. Mr. Foreyt charges \$40.00 per skunk he is able to trap. Katherine Barnes-Pawson agreed to act as Mr. Foreyt's local contact.

Meeting adjourned at 7:00.
